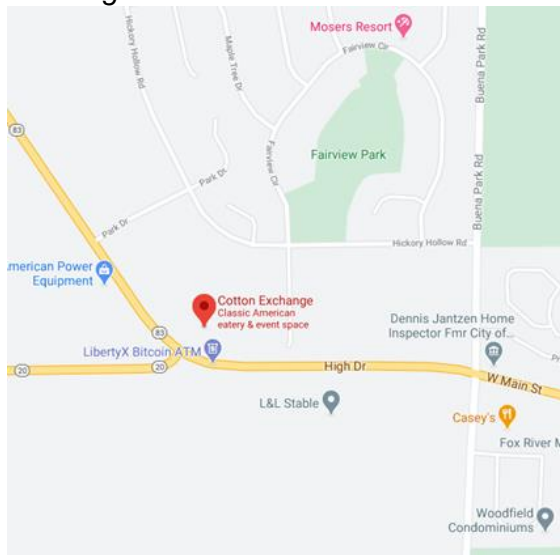

WORKSHOP SPEAKERS

Rick Clark, a fifth generation farmer in Warren County, Indiana. The story of Rick's transition from conventional farming to regenerative practices has propelled demand from other farmers to learn his strategies and garnered national attention. In 2017, Clark was honored as Dannon's Sustainable Farmer of the Year. Additionally, Land O' Lakes honored him with an Outstanding Sustainability Award, and he was also a regional winner of the American Soybean Association's Conservation Legacy Award. Rick was the 2019 Field to Markets recipient of the Sustainable Farmer of the Year award.

Tom Greil is a Waterford area farmer and has been experimenting with soil health and cover crops for the past six years. Tom is encouraging other farmers to utilize cover crops, but promotes all conservation practices. Tom's continued research on soil health will provide valuable information for the WPCR and farmers in Racine County.

Chad Sampson is the Racine County Conservationist. Chad connects farmers and landowners with resources, information, and cost-share funding to meet their conservation goals.

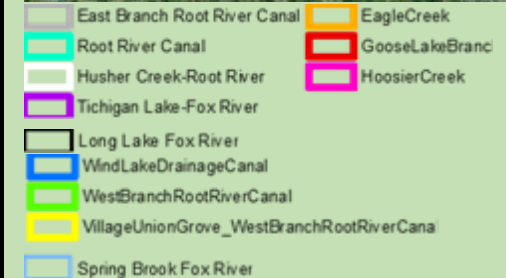
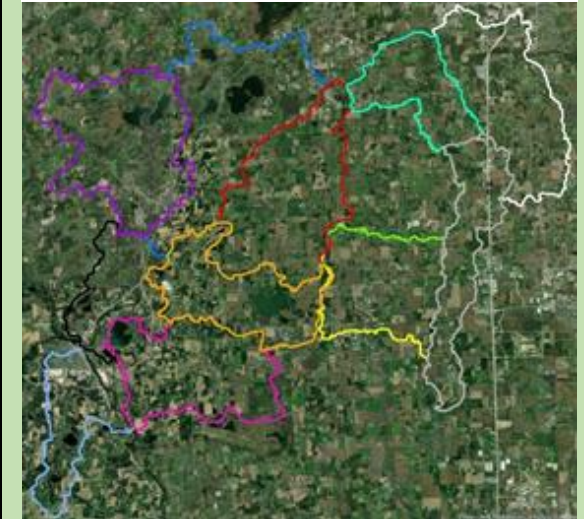
